

Please continue to read each night and sign the agendas nightly. Studies have proven that children who read/ are read to several times each week have higher success rates in school! I know this is a busy time of the year, but it is so very crucial to the students.

This is what we studied:

- Native American folktales like <u>Raven</u> by Gerald McDermott and created a totem pole showing beginning/middle/end of the story.
- Anansi the Spider-African folktales
- Word of the week was **patience**.
- What a compound word is: a word made up of small words that can stand alone
- Blends, digraphs, and long vowel/sneaky e patterns in words.
- Telling time by the hour (analog and digital)
- Counting by 5s.
- Story of Thanksgiving-pilgrims that came to America and Native Americans
- Fractions: whole (1), half (1/2), and fourth (1/4). You can ask your child to show you these by folding different circular/square items.
- We did a friction experiment using magazine paper, wax paper, and laminating
 plastic to see which material causes the most friction and which slides the
 best to make the best ice skates.
